Tidal Currents and Swell	All participating person	High	<ul> <li>Swimming only undertaken off the beaches immediately in front of the house on the south side of the island and not over the causeway area</li> <li>Tide times closely observed</li> <li>High water swimming only</li> <li>Water side observer watching the open sea for erratic swell</li> <li>Throw line immediately accessible to all</li> </ul>	Low
Open water	All participating and supervising persons	Medium	<ul> <li>Boundaries pointed out and enforced</li> <li>Clear visual and audible signals for use in the control of swimmers</li> <li>Clear positioning of person in charge of session observing with no blind spots</li> <li>Consideration should be given to the use of additional persons to help monitor swimmers</li> <li>Throw lines immediately to hand</li> </ul>	Low
Hidden underwater rocks	All participating and supervising persons	Medium	<ul> <li>No jumping permitted</li> <li>No diving permitted</li> <li>Swimming at high water only is recommended</li> <li>Beaches monitored for new hazards regularly</li> </ul>	Low
Cold water	All participating and supervising persons	Low	<ul> <li>Warm clothes on the beach adjacent to the water</li> <li>Towel close to hand</li> <li>Access to Lihou house for warming and hot drinks etc</li> <li>First aiders aware of the signs of hypothermia and the subsequent treatment</li> </ul>	Low
Injury caused by any of the above	All participating and supervising persons	Medium	<ul> <li>First aider present during activity and in known location/RV point</li> <li>First aid kit situated in the house</li> <li>Eye wash in the house</li> <li>Defibrillator situated in the house</li> <li>Emergency services trained and familiar with the house and island and familiar with both high and low water evacuation should it be required</li> </ul>	Low
Marine Mammals	All participants	Low	<ul> <li>Seals are reasonably common off the beaches of Lihou, swimmers should avoid swimming in areas obviously occupied by a seal</li> </ul>	Very Low
