Slippery rock	All participating and supervising persons	Medium	 Appropriate footwear to be worn Establish path in clear view of pool and any supervisors Swimming kit to be carried in a rucksack so participant has free hands Instructions given for the safe passage over such terrain No time constraints so as to discourage rushing 	Medium to Low
Hidden underwater rocks	All participating and supervising persons	Medium	 Jumping permitted only in places of known depth No diving Briefing given as to correct jumping technique No forward or backward flips Pool monitored for new hazards regularly No jumping for those supervisors unfamiliar with the pool and the depths 	Low
Cold water	All participating and supervising persons	Low	 Warm clothes on the rocks adjacent to the pool Towel close to hand Access to Lihou house for warming and hot drinks etc First aiders aware of the signs of hypothermia and the subsequent treatment 	Low
