Poisonous or hazardous plant forms	All participating and supervising persons	Medium	<ul> <li>The island is inspected regularly for any such poisonous or irritating plants to help identify potential problems</li> <li>Only known frequent plant of concern growing on Lihou is Deadly Nightshade (Berries in late summer/early autumn)</li> </ul>	Low
Injury caused to other island users	Third party island visitors	Low	<ul> <li>Activity area clearly visible to others and other island users clearly visible to chosen playing area</li> <li>Activity must ceased briefly if third parties walk through the area of activity</li> <li>Supervisory staff member maintaining an overview of the area and not directly involved with the organisation or participation of the activity</li> </ul>	Low
Injury caused by any of the above	All participating and supervising persons	Medium	<ul> <li>First aider present during activity and in known location/RV point</li> <li>First aid kit situated in the house</li> <li>Eye wash in the house</li> <li>Defibrillator situated in the house</li> <li>Emergency services trained and familiar with the house and island and familiar with both high and low water evacuation should it be required</li> </ul>	Low
